Research Postgraduate Courses

The following three Research Postgraduate courses are offered in REC:

RECO6021. Research Seminar I

This course aims to develop the student's abilities in the formulation of an appropriate research framework. Main issues include: literature search, qualitative and quantitative research approaches, experiment design, model building, data analysis and dissemination of results.

RECO6022. Research Seminar II

This course aims to familiarize students with academic rigor and to foster an appreciation of the many different means of carrying out research that exist. Main issues include the development of aims and objectives of the proposed research, determination and justification of a suitable research methodology, and deciding on a practical program for the execution of the research project. Students are required to give research seminar presentations of their work as they progress.

Note: *Students are required to complete this course by the end of the probationary period.*

RECO6024. Research Seminar III

[Pre-requisite: Satisfactory completion of Research Seminar II]

This course aims to enhance students' awareness of the nature and validity of research results and how the results relate to the body of theory of pertaining to their chosen topic. Main issues include: data analysis and interpretation, limitations and validity of results, appropriate methods of disseminating results.
